

BURN PERMITS - TN State LAW:

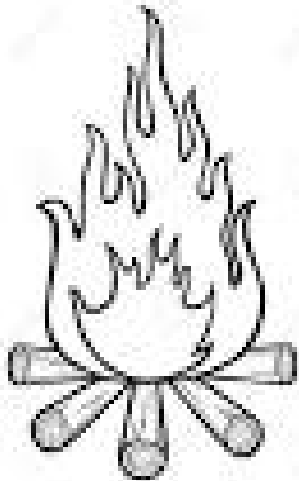
From **October 15th through May 15th**, anyone starting an **open-air** fire within 500 feet of a forest, grassland, or woodland must **by law** secure a **permit to burn** from the Division of Forestry. Permits are **not required for burning in containers** such as a metal barrel with a ½" mesh screen cover.

Permits are free of charge and may be obtained M-F from 8am-4:30pm by calling

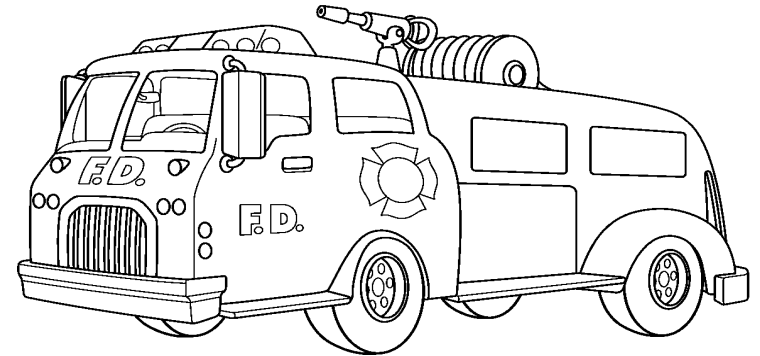

You will be given a number—please retain it while you have an active fire.
(Burn permits may be obtained in advance for weekends and holidays.)

In Tennessee, it is **ILLEGAL to burn**: tires and other rubber products; vinyl siding and vinyl shingles; plastics and other synthetic materials; **paper products, cardboard and newspaper**; asphalt shingles, and other asphalt roofing; materials and demolition debris; asbestos-containing materials; paints, household and agricultural chemicals; aerosol cans and **food cans**; building material and construction debris; buildings and mobile homes; copper wire and electrical wires; **household trash**; leaves, branches and trees **not grown on site**. The **ONLY LEGAL** things to burn are brush, leaves & such that are grown on that property.

Improper outdoor burning can lead to fines up to \$25,000.

The Greenback Volunteer Fire Dept. asks residents of Greenback and Lenoir City (**south** of the Ft. Loudoun Dam) to pay **\$100 per year** per house (*under 3500 sq.ft.*) to help with the cost of maintaining equipment & vehicles.

Failure to pay the annual **subscription fee** will result in charges (*beginning at \$2,000*) if you require assistance from the Greenback Fire Department for fire, water, medical emergency or any other rescue events listed on the website.
