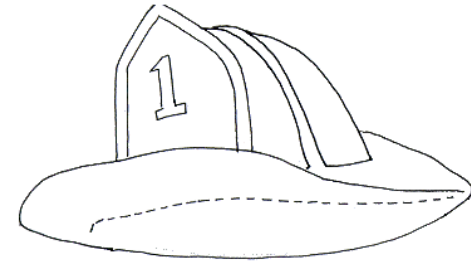
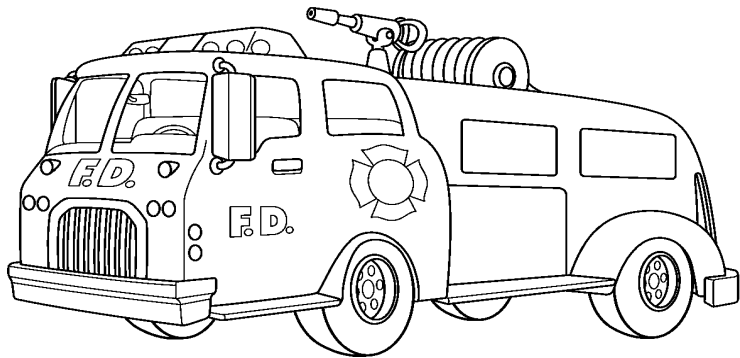

Open meetings take place every 1st & 3rd Tuesday of the month at 6pm at the Sugarlimb Station (except December) and training follows after each meeting. All members must take 96 hours of training per year.

BURN PERMITS - TN State LAW: **www.burnsafetn.org**

From **October 15th through May 15th**, anyone starting an open-air fire within 500 feet of a forest, grassland, or woodland must **by law** secure a **burning permit** from the Division of Forestry.

Permits are **not required for burning in containers** such as a metal barrel with a ½" mesh screen cover.

Permits are free of charge and may be obtained M-F from 8am-4:30pm by calling **986-8395**. You will be given a number—please retain it while you have a fire going. (*Burn permits may be obtained in advance for weekends and holidays.*)

In Tennessee, **it is ILLEGAL to burn:** tires and other rubber products; vinyl siding and vinyl shingles; plastics and other synthetic materials; **paper products, cardboard and newspaper;** asphalt shingles, and other asphalt roofing; materials and demolition debris; asbestos-containing materials; paints, household and agricultural chemicals; aerosol cans and **food cans;** building material and construction debris; buildings and mobile homes; copper wire and electrical wires; **household trash;** leaves, branches and trees **not grown on site.**

The **ONLY LEGAL** things to burn are brush, leaves & such that are grown on that property.
Improper outdoor burning can lead to fines up to \$25,000.
